In the last month I personally have officiated funerals for two people who died far too soon. One a 27 year old and the other a 58 year old. On top of that my wife had a family friend who died while still in her 50s, and I have seen the obituaries of several other relatively young people in our local news.

It's not like I, personally, needed a reminder of the reality that life is short and that we never know when our time on this earth will be done, after all my own father died at 40 and my stepfather was 58 when he passed on. As I approach my own 40th birthday in a little under two years, I can't fathom that I have lived nearly as long as my own dad.

But all these untimely deaths have me thinking of the Psalm that says, "Lord, teach us to number our days, so that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (90:12).

I believe this is an important reminder for all of us, because learning to number our days does indeed give us wisdom. When we truly embrace the reality that life is short, it helps us to gain perspective on what really matters in life. To use a title of a book that has become a sort of cliche, it helps us to "not sweat the small stuff" so much. When our days are numbered we prioritize the people and the things that we love. It should cause us to reflect on the things we spend our time doing... does this matter? Above all, when we number our days, we enter each new one with a sense of sheer gratitude.

I'm not saying that we should morbidly dwell on the truth that any moment we could kick the bucket. But more so that we should make our lives, and all of our days, count.

Who are you loving well?

What impact are you having on the world?

Are you making the sphere around you a better place?

For what will you be remembered?

How are you making your days count?

The club will be hosting the DeKalb County Grow Mobile in the United Methodist Church parking lot on Tuesday February 6. There will be all types of groceries and healthy vegetables available from 4 to 5 p.m. No verification is necessary and everyone is welcome at 801 N. Sycamore St. The Mobile pantry will again be available in Hinckley on the first Tuesday of April.



The Grow Mobile features fresh, locally grown vegetables during the summer and a selection of vegetables from the Northern Illinois Food Bank at other times. There are always groceries and other necessities offered on the Grow Mobile. Invite others who are hungry to take advantage of this mobile food pantry. The Hinckley Area Food Pantry is also open on the first and third Saturdays of the month. Lions are willing to help connect you with food pantries and the Grow Mobile at other times.

The Lions Club had a work day at the Northern Illinois Food Bank in Geneva recently to help prepare food for distribution in Northern Illinois. Reducing hunger is one of the major goals of Lions Club International.

HBR CUSD #429 Updates and Highlights

Greetings Community~

2024 sure came in making a statement! The snow and extremely cold temperatures resulted in alternative teaching and learning days just as we returned from break. The instructional staff did an excellent job flexibly planning instruction and our students and families were also great at adapting. The delayed start and asynchronous learning, balanced with synchronous live instruction and class meetings, allowed students to engage in the "traditional snow day play" while also learning and reviewing content. There was also spontaneous student-led learning, such as an impromptu virtual trip to Paris for one 3rd-grade class. The Buildings and Grounds crew worked hard, along with our road commissioners and the Viland/Bish plowing crew, to keep our roads, lots, and walkways clear. Such a great reminder that #TogetherWeAreHBR!

If you have been following the Board of Education meetings, you know we have some exciting renovations happening in our buildings this summer. We are updating the middle school parking lot by adding parking spots and a designated traffic flow to improve safety. Additionally, we are creating a second hallway entrance to the middle school gym on the north side to alleviate the bottleneck in and out of the gym. The middle school gym floor will be updated and refinished and the bleachers will be replaced. The cafeteria will be opened up to create a multi-use space when not being used as a cafeteria, similar to the elementary and high schools. The high school main entrance at door #1 and the west entrance at door #10 will be renovated to create secure entrances. The elementary school cafeteria will have noise absorption baffles and wall panels installed to help manage sound levels in the open space to keep from disrupting learning and create a multi-purpose meeting space. All three of the buildings will undergo improvements to reduce moisture and control noise between the classrooms as well as repair and replace needed HVAC units. All work is planned to be completed over the summer break. You can follow the progress and read updates about the project on our website



We have received \$802,500 in grants and \$123,453 in donations toward our estimated \$2,250,000 total need.

We are working on several more grants and still welcome any level of donation, which can be recognized in your name or in honor of a loved one.

We appreciate your patience as we work to create a welcoming, accessible new library for the Hinckley community. For a public entity working with federal funding, this process is a lot slower than for private businesses. No matter how long it takes, we are looking forward to an amazing new community space.

The Value of Recording Memories

Working at the Historical Society, soon proves the most valuable and often used artifact in our collection are the weekly newspapers. Hinckley has been blessed since 1878 to have had someone collecting and printing local news, personal stories, and events important to others. A huge hole in the ability to answer questions about Hinckley developed on January 25, 2000 when the paper closed its doors.



HHS is trying to fill that hole by recording interviews with people about their memories. Some of these interviews and memories may not be interesting or relevant to others for 20, 30 or more years in the future. Chances are that someday, these recordings will help in someone's research about their family, or house or event in Hinckley.

We appreciate the HBR high school students in Mr. Nick Sullivan's class and their interviewees who took time to record memories this past semester. It was a great learning experience for the students and invaluable addition to the HHS collection of our history. Hopefully students in the future will continue this experience.
