First Summer Band Concert June 13

Bring your lawn chairs and picnic basket for our first summer music concert on the Community Building lawn Tuesday June 13. The program starts at 6:30 with comments by HHS and then a variety of music provided by Bella's Second Shot Band. The 10-piece professional free-lance musicians feature a horn section, 2 vocalists, complete rhythm section and a sound engineer.



For the second year the Historical Society is sponsoring the free concerts to celebrate the history of music in our community and the summer days when the community gathered together.

While you are at the event, read the historical marker tribute along Maple Street to one of the school band directors. R.B. and Edna Wight recruited most of the students in school to learn to play an instrument and enjoy music. HHS also helped to bring 5 instrumental artists to the elementary school in April to talk about the value of music and demonstrate their artistic talents.

There will be four band concerts this summer including the Hinckley Festival and Fireworks concert on June 24. Plan to also join us for concerts on July 11 and August 8 on the Community Building Lawn starting at 6:30 p.m.

Write Short Memories for Our Collection

The Historical Society is participating in a state-wide project to capture short stories of life in our community and you are invited to join-in. Especially people over 50 years are encouraged to participate and to share in just a few pages their memories about a specific topic like life in Hinckley, on the farm, at school or what you did for fun while growing up.

Don't worry about your writing style or perfect English as the memories will be edited for grammar and then preserved in our historic collection. Plans are even being developed to record some of the stories on video for showing in our museum theater. From the experience of talking with visitors at the museum, HHS has learned there is a great interest in stories told in the narrator's own words.

The project will also draw attention to the varied experiences of residents in an era of cultural change and increase our understanding of how our community developed. All you have to do is write your memories about a specific event or time in your life and send them to HHS. Just one to three pages. Feel welcome to submit several memories which are planned to be bound in a notebook for our collection.

The public is invited to come to the museum to enjoy our collections, research your genealogy or house history, and access our Hinckley newspaper collection. You can schedule a convenient time by calling for an appointment even when the museum is not normally open to the public. This is one of the many benefits of membership in HHS.
