On the afternoon of October 1 at 2:00, you may see a large group of people from the surrounding communities walking here in Hinckley for the CROP Hunger Walk. The CROP Hunger Walk happening here in Hinckley is just one of hundreds that are happening in other communities nationwide. Together they are rallying around the theme of "ending hunger one step at a time."

The people that you see are walking because they believe they can make a difference both here locally and globally. They walk to show solidarity with the millions of people who walk miles every day in search of food and water. They walk to raise awareness for the millions served by local food pantries, food banks and meal sites here in the U.S.

They walk, and you can walk too! You can make a difference in our local community and in communities worldwide by either donating some money or walking yourself to raise awareness. 12.5% of all the funds raised will stay here in the local community to go to the Hinckley Area Food Pantry. The rest of the funds will go to do such things as combating droughts in Nicaragua, or providing agricultural training in Indonesia, or stocking shelves in hundreds of other food pantries across the United States. In fact, your participation will impact individuals and families in more than 35 countries where one in nine people lack access to clean water and a healthy diet.



These documents provide guidance for future development and land use in our village. The draft was developed by the Planning Commission after discussion and review of Comprehensive Plans of neighboring communities.

The Hinckley Plan is intended to outline and support the community's vision for development that improves the quality of life for residents. While it gives a snapshot of the community for anyone looking to move or start a business in Hinckley, the plan also gives village officials goals and possible strategies to achieving them.

Join the Cemetery Walk September 24

Come meet more of the distinguished deceased residents of Hinckley at the second annual HHS Cemetery Walk on September 24. The tour begins at 3 p.m. in the Greenwood Cemetery, south of Rt 30 on Somonauk Road.

During the walk, you will hear from Fannie Patterson, a Hinckley resident who was the first Black graduate of Hinckley High School and from what is now Northern Illinois University. There will be a dedication of her monument recently installed by the Historical Society and NIU. She was passionate about education and dedicated her short life to teaching underprivileged students.

The tour will feature other impersonators of renown Hinckley residents. The walk is open free to the public but donations are accepted for the work of the museum. Since this is a walking tour, plan accordingly for rain or shine. The museum will be open following the walk until 5 p.m.

Summer Season Band Concerts End on High Note

The second season of summer band concerts organized by the Historical Society came to a close on August 8. Over the two years, seven bands have kept the sound of music reverberating over Hinckley and encouraging today's students to join the school bands and keep the tradition of music alive in our community.

Conceived as a Ravinia-style outdoor concert, the events attracted over 500 people to the free concerts as they enjoyed the fresh air and comradery. Only one concert was held inside the Community Building due to the threat of rain. The bands were comprised of generally four or five professional musicians, but one band featured 20 instruments.

The bands were paid through grants from the Farny R. Wurlitzer Foundation and Illinois Humanities who support music education and the arts. Donations to HHS are encouraged if you wish to see the concerts continued next year.

Why Worry About Diabetes?

Nearly 14 million Americans have diabetes and half of them don't know it! Diabetes is a serious disease that can lead to blindness, heart attack, stroke, kidney failure and amputations. Diabetes is the fourth leading cause of death by disease in the United States.

Lions encourage everyone to be aware if they are at risk of having diabetes. Overweight, lack of exercise and relatives with diabetes are warning signs. Finding and treating the disease early, before it causes vision loss or blindness, is the best way to control diabetic eye disease. Lions encourage those with diabetes to get a dilated eye examination at least once a year.
